

## Water Filtration and Chlorination Project

Construction of upgrades and improvements to the Olympic Water and Sewer Inc. (OWSI) water system are being financed by the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF). The DWSRF program is administered by the Washington State Department of Health (DOH) with joint funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Washington State. The project will construct a water filtration plant located at 1306 Teal Lake Rd. in Port Ludlow and add chlorination to the water system. The benefits of the project will be a reduction of manganese and arsenic levels from two wells that provide water to 67% of the water system. Chlorination of the entire water system will disinfect the water to maintain water quality and protect public health for community members residing within the Port Ludlow Master planned resort boundaries. DWSRF programs operate around the country to provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects valuable water resources nationwide.
