SUBJECT: Anchorage - Washington State Marine Regulations, WAC 332-52-155

Dear Skipper/boat owner,

We take immense pride in our bay. It is a pleasant, safe, and quiet harbor for all boaters and visitors to enjoy. It has been observed that you have been anchored for an extended period time in the same area here in Port Ludlow Bay.

State laws prohibit a vessel to anchor in the same area on state-owned aquatic lands for periods longer than thirty (30) consecutive days or for more than a total of ninety days (90) in any three hundred sixty-five-day (365) period. For the purposes of WAC 332-52-155, "in the same area" means within a radius of five miles. For your convenience, a copy of WAC 332-52-155 is attached.

Your attention and compliance to the Washington State Marine Laws is appreciated. We are in contact with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) who is responsible for the care and administration of all aquatic lands of the state including Port Ludlow Bay. If further action is required, DNR will be the enforcement agency.

The Port Ludlow Village Council (PLVC) will continue to do all we can to ensure that Ludlow Bay is a favorite spot for you and others to visit repeatedly. As a reminder, all boaters can use the free pump facilities located at the marina fuel dock.
